Failing to Acknowledge God

There are the arrogant aggressive souls that smother their psyches with pride in their personal beauty and/or physical prowess, their intellectual or military achievements, their wealth or power. Such souls are usually casually cruel to others, often fostering social structures that make people non-citizens and deny basic human rights, and are constantly looking for new ways to expand (which is invariably through the misappropriation of resources from the more needy of their own or others' societies).

A major component of God's training for my soul has been in identifying how souls can degenerate from "normal" parameters into such vexatious moulds. This training led to the writing of "psychological escalation" nor "captive minions" nor "seiging the walls" (do not read if you are faint hearted) which were sent to my church leaders in July 2005. These papers try and describe the psychological issues of the extremists, so the churches can start to develop theological responses to these destructive paradigms (One of the extremists taunts is that we can't even agree on a definition of evil. If nothing else, this report should help to move the dialogue in this area alone). These papers were sent to my church in July 2005 to prepare them for an escalation in overt hostilities such as the December 2005 Sydney riots. Unfortunately, by remaining in denial of my purpose, they missed a chance to proactively prepare their flocks.

The lovers of violence continue making media releases such as those in December 2005 continuing to incite hatred and bombing in Iraq, claiming that it is their destructive influence that has caused countries such as the US to discuss handing back control to the Iraqi people. It is now so easy to see that these leaders are not from God because they repeatedly failed to publicly acknowledge God's influence in exposing the US's weaknesses and bringing them to their knees, and only look beyond their human activities. These thugs failed to acknowledge the influence of natural disasters such as Katrina, Rita, Wilma/Alpha/Nor'easter. [I loved the Jews when one commented after Katrina that it only took one storm to bring the US to its knees, they should have tried forty years in Exodus. American citizens' egos might have been hurt, but it was a Jew's recognition of familial ties and that God admonishes those He loves. It was also a clue as to how to move forward in God's reconciliation plan.]

The terrorist bandits also failed to acknowledge the impact of the December 2004 SE Asian tsunami and the October 2005 Kashmir earthquake in terms of awakening humanity's global consciousness for the need for compassion and to look beyond narrow political and military agendas.

These same lovers of perversion and violence (e.g. <u>Jeremiah 5:7-9</u>) demonstrated their bankruptcy in July 2005 when the whole world was praying for peace and a means to help the poorest of nations; these thugs sought to hi-jack the agenda back into an agenda of escalating fear and intimidation with the July London bombings. Unbeknownst to them, they walked directly into snare that God had set, because through their complacency and delusions they actually triggered an enlightenment for the majority of humanity came to recognize that they showed no regard for the gods of his fathers or for the one desired by women, nor will he regard any god, but will exalt himself above them all. The passage from Revelation 13:3-10 is even more interesting when you consider that it was forty two months from the September 2001 9-11 World Trade Centre to the Nias earthquake/Iraqi elections in March 2005. It is also interesting to note that a magnetar explosion occurred within a matter of days of the 2004 tsunami. When we read the bible we see that God does not respect these people, but that God also hands us over to such people when He considers us too adulterous and proud e.g. <u>Deuteronomy 28:50</u>, <u>Isaiah 66:1-12</u>, <u>Jeremiah 6:11-19</u>; <u>Ezekiel 16</u>.
